10. Kayla forgets to grease the brownie pan.

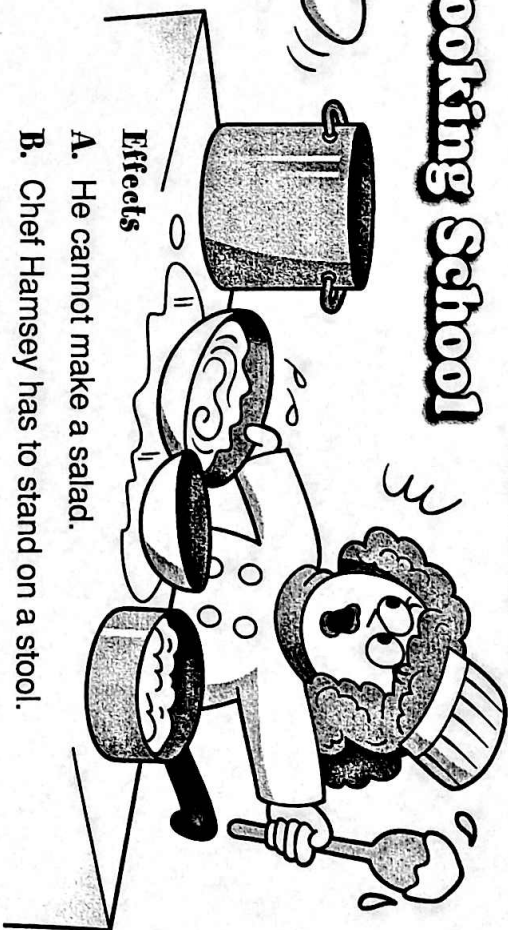
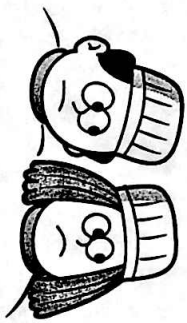
11. Taylor drops the pan of meatballs.
